## Polish Criminal Justice System

Warsaw, Krakow

This study abroad group will stay at the Police Academy in Legionowo near Warsaw and will also have an opportunity to visit different police stations, county police HQs, Metropolitan Police HQ—Warsaw, State Police HQ—Krakow, river police, police command & control centers, police training center for dog-handlers and dogs, Central Forensic Laboratory—Warsaw, Interpol & Europol National Bureau, jails & prisons, courts and prosecutor's office.

The sightseeing part of the trip includes the visits to the cities of Warsaw, Krakow, Czestochowa, Wieliczka Salt Mine, Auschwitz-Birkenau Nazi Concentration Camp.

For those registering for course credit, there will be pre-departure course work including readings and web-based materials.

We also encourage alums, practitioners and family members to join our students in these trips. By inviting alums and friends, we hope to broaden their knowledge and provide a very different kind of travel experience.

### **Courses description:**

**CRIMINAL JUSTICE SYSTEM STUDY ABROAD (3 credits):** This course will study the criminal justice system in Poland. During the trip, the students will visit different police stations, courts, educational institutions that will be supported by previous readings on the topic. At the end of the trip the students will write a paper about criminal justice system in Poland.

**INDEPENDENT STUDY (3 credits):** The students will conduct a research on one of the topics offered by the professor based on the sight visits, as well as readings and lectures. At the end of the trip the students will write a paper about their findings.

### **Sample itinerary (subject to change):**

During your stay in Poland you will stay at one of the Police Academies where you will be able to see the training of Polish police officers. Most mornings will begin with a class meeting or a field trip to different police departments, including Interpol and Europol offices. You will also be able to visit a correctional facility, meet a judge, and the prosecutor.

You will visit the cities of Warsaw, Krakow and smaller towns, like Piotrkow Trybunalski, Wieliczka and others.
