The Department of Criminal Justice, Henry C. Lee College of Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences, University of New Haven, is recruiting for two Tenure-Track Faculty appointments in Investigative Services. Non-Tenure Track or one-year Visiting Professor appointments may also be considered.

**Position/Rank:** Two Tenure-track Assistant or Associate Professor positions, or Non-Tenure Track Lecturer positions, or Visiting Professor faculty positions in the following specialty area:

**Investigative Services (Specify Search # 11-77)**

For Tenure Track appointments, experience in law enforcement investigations at the local, state or federal level is strongly desired. Research in investigative techniques is desirable. Non-tenure track appointments may be available. Non-tenure track candidates must hold a graduate degree in a related area or a J.D. degree, with substantial practical experience conducting investigations.

**Qualifications:** **Tenure Track** positions require a doctoral degree. A Ph.D. in Criminal Justice is strongly preferred. Another earned doctorate in a discipline other than criminal justice, that is otherwise consistent with the stated specialization, may also be considered. Doctoral Candidates (“A.B.D.”) who are nearing the completion of their doctoral degree program may also be considered for the Assistant Professor rank. A record of scholarship or the clear potential to publish is expected. A J.D. degree alone is not sufficient for any of these tenure-track appointments. All faculty positions require classroom teaching, scholarship, service and other duties consistent with the University’s *Faculty Handbook*. Applicants should provide evidence of teaching, scholarship, service, and any sponsored research or other grants/contracts activities.

The department may also consider applications for one-year Visiting Professor appointments, or for other non-tenure track faculty appointments (e.g., Lecturer) for one or both of these positions. **Visiting Professors** would generally be expected to hold a terminal degree appropriate to the area (e.g., a Ph.D.) and demonstrate a significant academic record or academic potential. For **Non-Tenure-Track** position consideration (e.g., Lecturer), a minimum of a relevant master’s degree or a J.D. degree and substantial, relevant practitioner experience is required.

**About the University**
