The 30 students attending the camp were given the opportunity to demonstrate their skills by investigating four mock crime scenes set up at the Henry

C. Lee College of Criminal Justice and Forensic Sciences. The students studied the scenes in teams, analyzing bloodstain patterns, fingerprints and physical evidence, hoping to "solve" the crime.
