

## Lyme film to be shown at University of New Haven

The Department of Biology and Environmental Science at the University of New Haven (UNH) is sponsoring a showing of the film *Under Our Skin: The Untold Story of Lyme Disease* on Thursday, Aug. 7, at the UNH campus.

The film, which was produced by Andy Abraham Wilson of the California-based Open Eye pictures, focuses on the controversies surrounding the diagnosis and treatment of Lyme disease.

The event will be hosted by Dr. Eva Sapi, an associate professor at UNH. Special guest will be Dr. Charles Ray Jones, a New Haven pediatri-

cian featured in the film. Dr. Jones has been the subject of a controversial investigation into his treatment of Lyme disease patients.

Connecticut leads the country in reported cases of Lyme disease, with 3,000 in 2007. Fairfield County had more Lyme cases than any other county in the state, with 470.

The event will take place at Dodds Theater on the UNH main campus. Doors open at 5:30 p.m., and the film starts at 6:30.
