General information about Alternate Spring Break:

An alternative spring break program places teams of college students in communities to engage in community service and experiential learning. Students leave behind the world of books and laboratories and enter communities struggling with issues of urban poverty, racism, hunger, inadequate housing, and environmental damage. In so doing, these students are able to contribute to the community through their hard work. Communities benefit from the tangible work completed, while students gain a broader understanding of the world around them.

The President's Public Service Fellowship places highly qualified UNH students in a non-profit or public service work environment. This program gives students valuable work experience, teambuilding and leadership skills, and awareness of the needs of their community.
