To those who know Moylan's dedication and passion, this was no surprise. From a small town in County Clare, Ireland to West Haven, Selina Moylan has left her mark. Not only does her passion for the game of soccer show when she wears a Charger uniform, but her love and dedication for the University of New Haven as well.

"She's one of the best Division II players in the country," said women's head soccer coach Brendan Faherty of Moylan, who has had nearly 40 goals and about 30 assists while wearing the Charger uniform. "She'll never be out-worked or out-played on the practice or game field. She wholeheartedly loves UNH and plans to continue pursuing her master's degree on campus."

The Irish standout received numerous calls from U.S. colleges and universities offering her a scholarship, including many Division I programs. When it came time to make her decision, drawing from her small-town instincts, her keen eye for a successful soccer program and her desire for one-on-one classroom interaction, she felt UNH and Division II was the



perfect fit for her. She's been a team leader, a two-year captain, a three-time All-Conference selection, a three-time All-Region selection and, ironically, a three-time All-American selection.

"I am very grateful and thankful that I got to be a part of this community," said Moylan. "It has changed my life in every way possible. I chose UNH. I chose Division II."

# Laying the "Groundwork" For Varsity Dreams

The UNH football program continues to grow in popularity as the word spreads about the program's resurgence. A state-of-the-art blue and yellow turf surface at DellaCamera Stadium was completed in early September, and the team, which held scrimmages this fall, has a number of new coaches on staff, including a handful of familiar faces.

Eighty student-athletes arrived in August to lay the groundwork for the program's first varsity season in six years next fall. Nearly 70 new freshmen football student-athletes were part of the largest incoming class in UNH history. The team also added a few transfer student-athletes and a number of current UNH students to their roster this fall.

"These student-athletes will be the core of the team for the next four years," said UNH Head Football Coach Peter Rossomando. "They gained immeasurable experience this fall and showed the character and dedication needed to become a top NCAA Division II program. The groundwork has been laid to make for a competitive inaugural Northeast-10 Conference season in 2009."

Scott James (Linebackers/Defensive Coordinator) joined the staff in January 2008 and Daryl Daleen joined the coaching staff in late July as the Special Teams Coordinator and Defensive Line coach. Others who joined or returned to the staff included Chris Anderson (Quarterbacks), Pierce Brennan (Offensive Line), Frank J. DeGennaro (Tight Ends), Charlie Fowler (Wide Receivers), Stan Holmes (Running Backs), Wayne Luciani (Outside Linebackers), Matt Scott (Defensive Backs), Tony Connor (Safeties) and John G. Svatik (Defensive Backs).
