












# DOC Youth Recidivism Rate • OPM reported in 2011, 10,008 inmates were released from DOC – Only 45 were under the age of 18 at release • 20 (44%) rearrested within one year • 33 (73%) rearrested within three years • Youth released had significantly higher recidivism rate than general DOC population
