Highlights of the College of Business First Semester Study Abroad in Prato, Italy Program

The Campus Location: Prato is a historically rich city with old city walls, a castle, and art all around you. It is not a touristy city and therefore you will be able to experience the real Italy.

Fun Ways to Meet Locals: The University organizes fun ways to meet local Italians including a conversation exchange program, a family dinner program, and a volunteering experience at a local school.

Day Trips! While in Italy you will travel with the University on five day trips around the Tuscany region including Pisa and Siena. This is no extra charge to students.

Value. It costs the same to study abroad in Tuscany as to study at the main campus as a resident student. All financial aid applies. The only extra costs are the round trip airfare (approx. \$1,200-\$1,500) and a cell phone.

Course Offerings: Take the coursework you need from international professors who bring a new perspective to your coursework. Your coursework will often include field trips or guest lecturers. Dr. Gil Fried, Chair of the Sport Management Program will be teaching at the Prato Campus this fall.
