### **EXPLORE RESOURCES ON CAMPUS**

Welcome to the University of New Haven, a diverse and welcoming community of faculty and staff from across the nation. We recognize that transitioning to college can be a daunting experience. We want you to know that you will have support all along the way. Make sure to check out our available resources and reach out if you have any questions!

- 1. Dean of Students: Our Dean of Students Dr. Ophelie Rowe-Allen is here to create a seamless learning environment in which your intellectual, social, and emotional well-being are recognized and fully supported. Feel free to stop by the Dean of Students Office in Bartels Hall, and connect with Dean Rowe-Allen about your needs, interests, or any student-support questions you may have.
- 2. Center for Student Engagement, Leadership, and Orientation (CSELO): We strongly encourage our students to get involved on our campus. CSELO will be hosting Charge In/Student Involvement fairs from August 16–22. This fair hosts representatives from over 150 recognized student organizations. - 3. Office of Residential Life: Living in one of our residence halls enables you to participate in a well-rounded educational experience that caters to your personal and professional development.

- 6. The Myatt Center for Diversity and Inclusion: The Myatt Center for Diversity and Inclusion assists the University in promoting cultural diversity, awareness, and sensitivity throughout the campus community. - 7. ChargerRec: Your physical and social success starts here. We embrace the diverse recreational needs of our students by offering a wide variety of programs, services, and facilities. - 8. Health Services: The Health Services office is the primary provider of on-campus medical care in cases of student illness or injury. Health Services is also responsible for educational health programs, including a weekly Women's Services Clinic that provides assistance and information about gynecological care. Health Services is located in the Nicholson Health Center on the ground floor in Sheffield Hall.
- 9. Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS): The Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) office believes that students are strong, capable, and resilient. We offer our services to support them and those qualities in times when they may need additional support to manage an array of mental-health challenges. We utilize students' own strengths and aid them in being able to function at their highest capacity.
  Our ultimate goal is for students to have the ability to identify and reach their own goals.
  - CAPS offers individual counseling, support group offerings, group counseling, support, and consultation services as well as medication management. They provide a variety of outreach options to students throughout the year in the campus community. CAPS is available 24/7 for crisis support and can be reached at 203.932.7333.
