



- Perceptive of artistic accomplishments

- The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records
- FERPA gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records
- These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level
- Generally, schools must have written permission from the student in order to release any information from a student's education record
